What's New

A Religious Renaissance

to Boost Ukraine?



WITH THE IMMINENT GRANTING OF AUTOCEPHALY TO THE ORTHODOX CHURCH IN UKRAINE, A NEW POTENTIAL RELIGIOUS, POLITICAL, AND SOCIETAL NARRATIVE WILL BE GIVEN AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE ESTABLISHED

It will be a modern iteration of "autonomy" of a centuries' old story, which will now be based on an independent and self-autonomous church, where Ukrainians who profess fealty to Ukraine, its people, and the fulfillment of the nation's promise will determine its destiny.

FOR AND AGAINST

Although some criticise the pursuit of this action as an act of political cynicism by Kyiv's political authorities at this particular time, such a view should be discounted. This recent development must be interpreted as a historic and revolutionary moment in Ukraine's national and religious narrative. In addition, it must be seen as both a recognition and affirmation of Ukraine's spiritual inheritance. It also must be perceived as a historic correction, and a rebuke of aggressive and chauvinistic attempts to destroy the Ukrainian soul, through the murder and persecution of the 'religious' and the destruction of thousands of churches.



NEW CRUSADE

Regardless of the effects on contemporary electoral politics, Ukraine should be seen as being on the verge of experiencing a renaissance that has the potential for effecting not only religious organisation and governance, but also something that can have a fundamental influence on political thought and practice, as well as having the potential of philosophically transforming the values by which Ukraine's society defines, governs, and interprets daily life. But perhaps the most relevant ramification of autocephaly, will be the discrediting and ultimate rejection of the long-accepted state of religious, political, and societal schizophrenia promulgated by a religious authority whose interests and values lie elsewhere. In this regard, the

protestations of Moscow related to this

TRANSPARENCY

move are notable.

Apart from the questions of governance, the movement of clergy, and the transference of churches, the most fundamental question confronting the church should be: how will it use and define its institutional independence in Ukraine's modern social order?

In a vastly corrupt the society such as Ukraine, the church's greatest strength lies in its moral relevance. Its institutional efficacy and ultimate integrity will only be affirmed within greater Ukrainian society if it establishes its unique separateness and "prophetic voice". Though the church's historic and traditional role as a primary definer of Ukraine's national and state identity cannot be discounted, as we look to the future its institutional effectiveness as a transforming power must not be solely defined by political prowess. An independent church cannot, and should not, be a servant of the state, just as the state cannot be a slave to the church.

POLITICS ASIDE

The newly independent church must seize the opportunity and use its unique voice of moral authority to further introduce and inculcate transforming values into Ukraine's societal order. Values such as the transcendent dignity of human individuals, the presence of objective truth, the promise contained within following the rule of law, the pursuit of the ideals of justice, and of helping the poor and suffering.

In concert with its theologians and laity, the church must develop a relevant language and philosophical structures that will act as a foundation for modern institution building. At the same time, it must not compromise its efforts in helping civil society deconstruct the discredited philosophical assumptions of the status quo that continue to oppress the majority of society. The newly independent church must take on a leadership role in the transformation of Ukrainian society. It must do so because reform efforts have been proven to be morally vacuous.

RESPONSIBILITY

There can be no doubt that an independent church must aggressively fulfill its responsibility as the curate of Ukraine's unique soul, playing an intricate and involved role in defining Ukraine's modern quest, or even pilgrimage, towards becoming a free society. Though the primary role of the church is the proclamation of the gospel and the salvation of human souls, it also has an essential role to play in the formation of a just order.

The most profound understanding of autocephaly, or "independent autonomy", will be when the church will contribute to the transforming of the modern fabric of Ukrainian society by condemning the pervasive corruption within the country's institutions; when it will continually affirm individual human dignity in the public square; and when it fulfills its teaching mandate by explaining and providing moral guidance towards the understanding of the promise of human fulfillment that is found through living daily life by the rule of law.

IN CONCLUSION

By introducing a concept and language of hope, and contributing to enshrining the same within Ukraine's order of society, the church will be using its independence and authority to help establish a positive life culture.

from Moscow

Ukraine Launches New National Women's Hockey Team

After two successful seasons of holding a national championship, the Ukrainian Ice Hockey Federation announced this summer that they will launch a national women's team for the first time in 23 years. The federation announced that Vadim Radchenko, coach of the national champion Kharkiv Panthers, will be the team's first head coach. Tryouts for the team will be held on 17-28 September in Boguslav, Kyiv oblast. The team will travel to South Africa in January for its first international competition since 1995, and face Belgium, Bulgaria, Hong Kong, and South Africa for the right to advance to Group B of the Women's World Hockey Championship. The tournament will be held on 13-18 January.


Daring to be Different: UFW SS19

Exploring Reitarska

One Street Transforming the City

REITARSKA STREET IS UNDERGOING AN URBAN TRANSFORMATION, TURNING INTO A VIBRANT PLACE WHERE YOUNG OPEN-MINDED CREATIVES SPEND DAYS AND NIGHTS

Why is one of Kyiv's oldest streets drawing so much attention? What's On heads to Reitarska to find out.

BOHEMIAN RHAPSODY

Every Friday evening people flock to Reitarska Street in droves. Young urbanites, dressed in bold hipster outfits with 90s-like haircuts hang out on pavements and in yards. The music, laughter, and heated discussions flood the street, and to an incidental passer-by this scene may conjure comparisons with walking somewhere in Berlin rather than in Kyiv. It doesn't matter if it's Monday or Friday: Reitarska draws in crowds like a magnet all week long.

It's hard to define when exactly the transformation of Reitarska occurred. Some point to it as probably happening when the underground-style Bar/13 occupied a cellar on Reitarska 21/13 at the end of 2014. Un-

Over the next couple of years, a variety of eateries, coffee shops, and showrooms featuring Ukrainian designer clothes settled on Reitarska too. By offering high-quality services, organising parties until sunup, and keeping the street clean and safe, these new arrivals managed to turn Reitarska into a cultural scene key to the youth-focused urban transformation of Kyiv.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Although represented by a mix of architectural styles from the 19th to early 20th century, Reitarska still seems a thoroughly modern street.

However, its roots are much older and date back to the times of Kyivan Rus'. During the rule of Yaroslav the Wise (1019-1054), Reitarska was a bustling part of what was then the so-called 'Yaroslav's city' occupied by merchants. Geographically it led to the Lvivska Brama (Lvivska Square today), one of the main entrances to Medieval Kyiv. After the Mongol invasion in 1240, Kyiv was ultimately destroyed and Reitarska fell into disrepair until the 18th century.

As a result of an agreement signed in 1654 between Cossack hetman Bohdan Khmelnytskiy and Vasiliy Buturlin, The Hetmanate (the former name of the Ukrainian state) submitted to the protection of the Tsardom of Russia. Afterwards, Russian cavalry also known as reiters or "black riders" started arriving in Kyiv. They settled on the place where present-day Reitarska Street lies. In 1803, Reitarska appeared on the city map for the first time.

OUTSTANDING RESIDENTS

The street started drawing talented people long before 2018. A memorial plaque

like the other city bars at that time, Bar/13 was a place where guests had a chance to drink signature cocktails, listen to local DJs, and let off steam in a relaxed atmosphere that didn't require a dress code. Bar/13 has quickly caught on and earned a reputation of a "bar for everyone and anyone".

PLAN FOR A PERFECT DAY-OFF ON REITARSKA STREET

10.30 Shake off the sandman with a coffee and healthy breakfast in Kashtan Coffee. Play chess or listen to music on vinyl inside the café
11.30 Drop by Haze (for the girls) or Chop-Chop (for the boys) to get a stylish haircut
12.30 Take your new hair for a walk and go shopping to Katimo Clothes (for the girls), Riot Division (for the boys), or Kapkan Shop or Syndicate (for both)

13.30 Occupy a table by the window in Zigzag and order meatballs with pasta and pesto 15.00 Head to Dykat art gallery and immerse yourself in modern visual art

16.00 Kick back at the discrete coffee shop Hidden on the second floor of the same building 17.00 Just walk around. Find the entrance of Osnovy publishing house on Heorhiwskiy Lane. Go to the third floor and enjoy the scent of freshly published books.

18.00 Drop by Bar/13 for a cocktail or two and have a deep and meaningful chat with the

19.00 Wrap up the day walking along the street and enjoying its incredible heritage

adorning a wall at Reitarska 19B says that famous Ukrainian composer and pianist Mykola Lysenko (1842-1912) lived here. What's more, it was here he met with Pyotr Tchaikovsky (1840-1893) who was deeply impressed by Lysenko's opera Taras Bulba. What's interesting, the brilliant writer Mikhail Bulgakov (1891-1940) and his first wife used to rent an apartment at Reitarska 25 in 1913 right after their wedding.

ARCHITECTURE AND ART

Not only are the houses where Lysenko and Bulgakov lived worth a closer look, in Soviet times, one of the city hospitals occupied a fascinating old building at Reitarska 22, designed in Venetian Gothic style. Legendary Ukrainian surgeon Mykola Amosov used to work here in the 1950s. Unfortunately, today this extraordinary building lies abandoned and requires urgent renovation.

The street also features an example of rational architecture – head to Reitarska 34 to get a real feel of this Italian architectural movement from the 1920s.

Speaking of modern art, the street boasts spectacular murals that completely cover two neighbourhood walls. A portrait of world-known Ukrainian poet Lesia Ukrainka adorns a building standing right at the intersection of Reitarska and Striletska streets. Inspired by her poem Lily of the Valley, Australian street artist Guido van Helten created one of the most beautiful murals in the city depicting Ukrainka in her younger days.

Another mural is hidden in the secret "yard with ravens". Go through the arch at Reitarska 9 to find it. After passing through the arch, you'll find yourself in a small yard leading to the underground coffee shop Kashtan. A mural with big grey ravens covers the wall on your right. Take a moment to find three black ravens that have been living in this yard for more than 15 years and have already become a part of the street's history.

DISTRICT NO. 1

Fortunately for the city, local businesses that have settled in the neighbourhood haven't neglected its valuable heritage. To encourage people to spend more time on Reitarska, local entrepreneurs have collaborated and kicked-off exciting initiatives like the vintage market Kyivness or The District #1 Block Party. These initiatives aspire to not only make the neighbourhood more liveable but also raise money for the street's improvement. The co-founder of Reitarska-based Kashtan coffee shop, Oleg Kamluk, was among the Block Party organisers too. Kamluk says after the event organisers had planned to revamp the square located at the intersection of Reitarska and Striletska streets. But as it turned out, city authorities already had plans for the square's improvement. So they shifted their attention to another square

that lies in front of the former city hospital. Unsurprisingly, local residents were very enthusiastic about the idea of a revamp and so is the new owner of the hospital building. "Right now we're in the middle of the negotiation process. I hope we'll finally assert the right to save the square and turn it into a comfortable place for all citizens."

Today, Reitarska constantly draws visitors, entrepreneurs, and artists who want to be part of the Reitarska community. The District #1 Block Party project has brought a new urban experience to the city. Reitarska proved that one well-thought-out street can attract smart and inspiring people more than new shopping malls or clubs. However, the street still needs some restoration and funds to keep its heritage in good condition, the hope being that city authorities and local residents will support local urban initiatives more actively.

Kamluk reflects on the future of Kyiv positively: "Today we are just beginning. I'm sure in the future there will be more similar festivals and socially-responsible businesses ready to change our city for the better."

What's On the Move

I've just picked up my wheels for a couple of days, a Land Rover Discovery, and my first thought is it's big, really big. The shape of this new Discovery is not as boxy as previous versions, and there's a necessary running board along the side to help people climb in. The inside is a mix of sumptuous leather and buttons for the range of toys on the central console. Getting used to the controls takes less than a minute, getting used to the size may take a little longer.

A WIELDY BEAST

As the engine purrs to life thanks to a keyless push button start, it's clear that this is a diesel. A such, I'm thinking it's not going to be particularly quick and will likely need a heavy right foot. Pulling onto Kyiv's Ring Road is never an easy thing to do thanks to a combination of heavy traffic and poor drivers (many of whom must have got licenses out of a candy box), which means extra care is needed, particularly when driving a car that costs a shade over 80 000 USD. Interestingly, when I spot my gap and give it a firm push on the accelerator pedal, it takes off like a scolded cat. I'm not leaving elevenses on the tarmac, because this thing grips like a race car, but I am leaving any preconceived notions of diesel engines in my wake.

As I settle into the drive and start to relax, I'm struck by how much the Discovery has evolved. It was always a mid-point option: as tough as the Land Rover Defender but with many of the refinements of the luxurious Range Rover. While still as tough as the Defender, it is no longer the case that it contains "many" of the refinements of the Range Rover: it basically has all of them. Which means this vehicle isn't a compromise, it's a luxury, borrowing the full range of bells and whistles from its sister vehicle. Seeing the road open up, it's time to once

again feel the power; but this time intentionally and in full expectation of the grunt the 3.0 litre turbo diesel is going to give. The rush doesn't disappoint

and I catch up to the traffic in front far too quickly, and the brakes are an appropriate strength, in relation to the engine wink.

MAN MELDS WITH MACHINE

As I arrive home, I'm faced with the challenge of threading this beast through narrow arches and between parked cars to find my own parking space; a dauting feat in a car this size. Or, merely at first. The gear selector is a wheel: flicking it between R and D takes some getting used to. But then assistance devices unfold before my eyes. Cameras show where we are, sensors beep when we (yes, the car and I are now one) get too close to something, the wing mirrors automatically dip to give us the most helpful view, and after a short back and forth, the engine is given a rest.

Once parked up I get into the back of the car to check out the passenger's accommodations. The back seat isn't the "back" seat, because this car actually contains three rows of seats, ideal for a larger family. The seats that would normally be the last line are set out in a formation for two,

with plenty of leg room and a drinks holder, which could double as a card table on longer journeys.

Technology

As I try to figure out how to access the last line of seats, I find a couple of buttons just inside the real door, and, of course, I push them. They say the only difference between men and boys is the price of their toys, and what a toy this turns out to be. By pushing these buttons electric motors whir the middle row of seats, as the headrest of the back row of seats flops down like a nodding donkey. This is followed by movement of the next row, and as if by magic, the rear row of seats are stowed completely into the floor of what is now a traditional boot space. Guess how many times I had to test this operation...

By the time it had to leave the disco, I was sad. I'd got used to the location of the gear selector so that it felt totally natural, and maneuvering in tight spaces didn't daunt me a bit. Not to mention the gas pedal. Maybe, just maybe, she and I will get to dance again one day.



UKRAINE KICKS OFF UEFA NATIONS LEAGUE IN STYLE

Ukraine vs Czech Republic 16 October at 19.00 Metalist Stadium (Kharkiv)

Ukraine came out to a flying start in their Nations League debut, knocking off both Slovakia and the Czech Republic to take the maximum points. What's On Means Business

Placing Ukraine on the Global Healthcare Map

LAUNCHED JUST OVER THREE YEARS AGO, DOCTOR SAM HAS EVOLVED INTO A HIGHLY EFFECTIVE NETWORK OF THREE AMBULATORY CLINICS. FURTHERMORE, IT IS A PLACE WHERE QUANTITY GOES ALONG WITH A QUALITY THAT IS GLOBALLY RECOGNISED

Doctor Sam is one of Kyiv's great options for the medical needs of children and adults in various fields, including paediatrics, therapy, gynaecology, cardiology, orthopaedics, ophthalmology, psychology, and MORE, while also offering vaccinations and diagnostics. But that's not the only reason this medical group is gaining favour in the local community.

Doctor Sam recently became Ukraine's first Joint Commission International (JCI)-accredited entity. A Gold Seal of Approval, JCI was founded in 1994 by The Joint Commission, the US' oldest standard-setting body in healthcare.

"Right from the start I knew we would have to obtain this accreditation for all of our clinics, it was a must for us," explains Dr Sam Aganov, PhD and MBA, group founder and CEO, who earned his degrees and experience in Minnesota and California. "In this past year, instead of opening more clinics, we devoted most of our attention, energy, and focus on getting ready to secure the world's toughest, strictest, and fairest certification in medicine and healthcare facilities."

Apart from professional self-esteem, Aganov says they feel a sense of national pride in fulfilling this ambitious task, which took more than two years of intense preparation. "Check the JCI site to see if a country you travel to boasts JCI-accredited facilities. The system reaches more than 90 countries. Some time ago, Ukraine was not on this list, which bothered me. We actually put Ukraine on the JCI map," Aganov says, proudly.

AB OVO

Since most of the JCI standards were unknown to Ukrainians earlier, let alone implemented here, Aganov started educating his medical personnel on what it was all about and why it was so important. They

then set to develop their general policies and procedure according to JCI standards. "The written rules have a practical meaning and positive impact on what we do," says Aganov. "Every one of our personnelfrom doctors to nurses or cleaning crew know the rules and adheres to them. For example, before we hire our medical staff we conduct a primary source verification. We get respective universities to confirm that a job candidate did obtain a degree there. This is unusual for Ukraine, but we do it." Doctor Sam staff underwent extensive life support and fire safety training and on a regular basis, they continue performing various emergency drills.

Before any invasive procedure, Doctor Sam always uses two patient identifiers (a full name and date of birth) to minimise mis-



takes and maintain patient safety. In this regard, little things that typically go unnoticed assume well-deserved importance. "It is no secret that doctors must wash their hands before examining a patient. However, as the JCI prescribes, patients should see them do it," Aganov says. Thus, Ukrainian patients are also educated about what proper treatment stands for.

WHAT'S IN IT FOR YOU

As advocates for a comprehensive approach to healthcare, Doctor Sam makes it easy for families to consult three or more doctors during one visit. Moreover, the clinics appeal to people who take care of their health and don't wait until something bad happens. "Come to us not only when you get sick. Come to us in order not to get sick," says Aganov.

Doctor Sam boasts innovative and advanced options like Teleconsultation that

enables clients to get qualified advice from specialists without leaving home. All a patient needs is a computer, web camera, and internet access. "For this service, we use a specially-built platform that guarantees privacy and confidentiality of our clients' data," says Aganov.

A second opinion is good for those wishing to double check a prescription made by somebody else and get alternative advice.

"We don't have a surgery department yet


"We don't have a surgery department yet. However, we keep on expanding and plan to open a hospital in the future. Right now, we can arrange an operation abroad at one of our partners' facilities," Aganov explains. Needless to add, the English-speaking community constitutes quite a part of Doctor Sam clientele. In case a doctor does not speak English – which is rare – the clinics provide an interpreter.

IT HAS JUST BEGUN

Trained in the US, Aganov came to Kyiv for a specific American-run project, on the completion of which he launched his own project and has remained here. "Once the project was over, I found it morally difficult to catch a plane and fly away. I thought Ukrainians deserved something better in terms of healthcare. With the JCI accreditation, our work has just begun. I hope other clinics will also go for it. The first three clinics in Ukraine are now accredited by JCI. It will be interesting to see which one will be the fourth. In the meantime, we feel very fortunate to be in a position to enable change on a large scale in the country," Aganov concludes.

War No Comment, and World We Defend

How does it feel to be a soldier on the frontline? Do fleeting memories of life events like a first kiss flood as artillery fires overhead? Or do trouble-free school days spark recollection in between offensives. Who are these heroes – both troops and civilians – living in the war zone holding the aggressor at bay? You will see their faces in the contemporary War and Peace – two photo albums produced by Ukraine's Ministry of Defence.

AN IDEA IS BORN

The idea of creating these books occurred to the Ministry's officials some time ago during working trips abroad. The international community – misled by Russian propaganda – knew next to nothing about the armed hostilities that erupted in Ukraine's eastern regions four years ago and continue today. "The best way to tell a true story about our country is to show photos that capture the reality of life in the conflict-afflicted zone," Colonel Victoria Kushnir, assistant to the Defence Minister and press secretary, says.

Both books are the joint effort of professional civilian photographers and military media experts, including Anatolii Stepanov, Alina Klimenko, and the famed Russian-born Sergei Loiko, the only foreign journalist who witnessed the 2014 Donetsk Airport siege. "All of them were happy and eager to volunteer for this important social project," Kushnir adds.

War No Comment is the title of the first volume. Short captions below images speak for themselves – "Consequences of Militants' Firing on Mariinka Village", "Night Combat at Butivka Mine", and "Soldier Shooting With a Heavy Machine Gun". "This is a good example of quality photojournalism without

"This is a good example of quality photojournalism without retouching," says Colonel Vadym Kovaliov, editor-at-large in the Narodna Armiya (People's Army) newspaper who also contribut-

ed to the project. His photos captured some crucial events like the liberation of Sloviansk, Kramatorsk, and

Artemovsk by national forces in July 2014.

The cover of the sequel *World We Defend* is designed as camouflage with patterns of a

rushnyk, a traditional embroidered towel. The book focuses on those Ukraine's army fights for – children and retired people, and highlights a patriotic sentiment of the nation united to build a peaceful future in their homeland.

"While fighting for its sovereignty and territorial integrity, Ukraine protects the entire civilised world from aggression. Therefore, we want to let the world know what is truly going on in our country," Kushnir says.

The books have been handed out to Defence Ministers in EU states, the US, Canada, NATO, as well as to Ukrainian embassies in various countries, the US European Command, heads of delegations at the UN Peacekeeping Defence Ministerial Conference in Vancouver and other high-ranking authorities. "Yale University students who came to Ukraine for the first time said the books gave them a lot of new information," Major Iryna Makarchenko, head of the Strategic Communications Coordinating and Monitoring Section, says. "We also plan to present our volumes at the Invictus Games that will take place in Australia in late October."

Out of six contenders, Ukraine has selected Sergei Loznitsa's tragicomedy *Donbass* to compete for selection in the foreign-language Oscar race to take place in Los Angeles on 24 February 2019.

Based on documentary materials and filmed in Kryvyi Rih (southeast of Ukraine), *Donbass* is a coproduction between Ukraine, Germany, France, and the Netherlands.

"The movie's budget equalled about 72 million UAH with state support amounting to 23.5% or nearly 17 million UAH," comments Serhiy Neretin, First Deputy Head of Ukraine's State Film Agency.

The movie is, at times, not an easy-watch and highlights the ongoing conflict in the country's eastern regions fuelled by Kremlin-directed forces. The plot focuses on people forced to adapt to living on the occupied territory amidst a drastic collapse in family values, professional ties, and all institutions. Is it possible to preserve dignity and reason in a world dominated by lies and propaganda?

Donbass Submitted for Oscars




Movie critic Oleksandr Husev comments: "While reflecting a Ukrainian contemporary drama, it is a universal narration demonstrating what happens to human nature when fear of punishment is lost or, on the contrary, bends under a burden of this fear."

The movie has all chances to be short-listed for Oscar contention as it already won the hearts of European audiences at the 2018 Cannes Film Festival. *Donbass* opened the Un Certain Regard section and even got Loznitsa a best director prize in this category. Though he did not attend the ceremony, he sent in his statement: "In the past few days, when talking to journalists and filmmakers from all over the world, I realised how little they knew about this ongoing war right in the heart of Europe."

So far, *Donbass* has been presented at festivals in Karlovy Vary, Munich, Melbourne, Jerusalem, Toronto, and Odesa. In Kyiv, its official premiere was scheduled on 18 October. However, according to the Academy Awards requirements, it will be screened earlier – during the week of 20 to 27 September in Zhovten Cinema. Make sure you get a ticket.

Kyiv on Screen

Ukraine's capital is both beautiful and rich in terms of architecture and history. Perhaps this is one of the reasons why over the past few years more and more of the city is featuring in western music videos, commercials for international brands, and other high-quality video content.

One of the most popular Kyiv locations for shooting is the unfinished Podilsko-Voskresenskiy Bridge. The advertising video Go with the Flaw by fashion label Diesel and, as title suggests, featuring unconventional models, featured the bridge prominently. Recently, this clip received three Cannes Lions Awards - for directing, production design, and camera work. In addition, automakers Nissan, Mazda, and oil and gas company Total S.A. also filmed commercials on the bridge. You can see the location in the music video of the French rapper OrelSan – Basique. By the way, the artist made a video for the song Tout va Bien in Kyiv also.

The second significant place for filming Kyiv is the metro. Vydubychi metro station can be seen in the final scene of the Lacoste promo clip - Timeless, The Film. Dorogozhichi and the Zoloti Vorota stations served as sets for advertising Google Pay. The shooting commercial for Apple Watch Series 3 was principally conducted at the Kyiv-Pasazhyrskiy railway station, but also the video features footage from Zoloti Vorota station.

The third lure for producers are post-Soviet houses and factories, which can be found, in particular, in the Troyeschina area. In this area, the Danish artist MO shot a video for the single Kamikaze, and the Foals filmed a video for the song What Went Down. The main set in the clip by Nothing But Thieves - Amsterdam was a tank factory, which is also located in Troyeschina. The group has an affinity for the city and on the left bank of Kyiv, Nothing But Thieves also shot a video for the song *Sorry*.

Among other artists and brands to have chosen Kyiv as a backdrop are: Twenty One Pilots, Calum Scott, Hurts, Lonely The Brave, Natalie Imbruglia, Years & Years, Tame Impala, Paloma Faith, Avicii, Busy P, BOEF, NCT U, Uniqlo UK, Nike, and Eric Bompard. Our fair city has seen its fair share of architectural love affairs, and it's not hard to understand why...

For those who don't know, the electrichka is a very slow, very uncomfortable, local train teeming with interesting stories and fascinating characters. It's like you have a front row seat to a Ukrainian sitcom set in the village. One that your Ukrainian friends have grown up watching and are all too familiar with.

Maybe you'll feel you've tuned into an episode titled *The Feast*, where you'll become keenly acquainted with the nuances of every smell Ukrainian food can make. This one is often paired with The *Hot Box*, where babushkas explain the many health benefits of keeping windows closed to prevent the famed Ukrainian draught of wind (aka protyah).

Maybe you're in for the comedy of *The Drunken Flirt*, where a man entirely too old to be hitting on a college student amuses the wagon's audience with some of the more entertaining pick-up lines this side of Krakow.

You'll want to learn what happens to *The Crammer*, the university student who didn't quite finish all her studying while home for the weekend and needs to pass an all-important exam upon arrival.

The Electrichka

Or *Sleeping Beauty*, the audience-participation episode of trying to wake a hungover alcoholic so that a child can take a seat.

Hollywood has nothing on the electrichka when it comes to entertainment. Every episode features multiple musical guests, like the upbeat harmony of *The Travelling Romas*, the reverent baritone of the *Soulful Seminarian*, or the gravelly charm of the *Busty Babushka* busting out a traditional Ukrainian tune.

No need to bring your own treats either as every wagon offers its own distinct selection of Soviet-era indulgences, including flimsy potato chips, antique candies, or whatever the Zhyvchyk drink is. If you get the chance, check out one of each season's 'special episodes', like the first day of school or the first day of holidays. Literally standing room only, you'll get to meet such popular characters as "cyclist that isn't cycling", "foreigner with oversized backpack", "farmer with no running water", and the firm-favourite – "guy with live chickens". Afterwards, be sure to share the episode with your Ukrainian friends. They are certain to share their favourite episodes right back with you.


Mission Impossible

They opened with much fanfare, but one key factor was overlooked. The 21st century upgrade to the stairs between

Peizazhna Alley (Landscape Alley) and the Honchari-Kozhumyaki area leading to Andriivsky Descent was unveiled by Mayor Vitali Klitschko in July. He and other city officials lauded the opening, which — like an 80's American TV show — starred "in alphabetical order": alarm buttons, CCTV, LED lighting, observation decks, and WiFi. It isn't the 80's and the 'star' that possibly should have received lead billing in the alphabetical opening credits was 'accessibility'. That is something disability advocate and Paralympian Dmytro Schebetyuk of Dostypno.ua put to the test when he attempted to use the stairs in August — it proved impossible. Schebetyuk, who uses a wheelchair, and is known for his work to improve accessi-

bility for people with disabilities across Kyiv, published a tongue-



in-cheek video of his attempts to negotiate the stairs as What's On went to print last month. His point is simple. The multi-million UAH upgrade – the first in more than half-a-century – to a track that has been used for more than a millennium and runs over 200 metres, and has a gruelling 247 steps (even for the most able-bodied) and, as he puts it, you'd think in 2018 other factors might have been considered. They weren't.

While the overall reaction to the upgrade was

positive, people were quick to point out on social media that alongside people who have issues with mobility, the steps were also unfriendly to mothers with strollers, and to cyclists.

Kyiv City Administration officials hit back, arguing the slope is too steep to make ramps or other forms of access feasible or economically viable. Meanwhile, the steps are part of a wider plan to

construct a tourist trail through the historic centre that links to Volodymyrska Hill and on to Druzhbi Narodiv (Friendship of Nations) Arch. As work progresses, Schebetyuk, and others, will be watching.

For the past three years, the largest national holiday in Ukraine – Independence Day – has combined with concerts by Okean Elzy. Kharkiv, Odesa, and Lviv marked the occasion with the Ukrainian super-group in previous years. This year, it was Kyiv's turn. Okean Elzy has previously appeared at the biggest stadium in Kyiv twice: the first time it was to celebrate the 20-year anniversary of the band, featuring former members of the group as a special treat. The second time was in 2016, to launch the album Bez Mezh.

This time round there wasn't too much new material to present – only three songs since their last album: *Bez Tebe*, *V Nebo Zhene*, and *Skilky Nas*. However, the people have missed their favorite musicians (this is the only concert the band has scheduled for 2018) and the stadium filled again.

Okean Elzy likes to showcase Ukrainian music and talent and featured two guests to open: DJ Katro Zauber with a set of Ukrainian songs and Dakha Brakha, who experiments with ethnic music and have sold out shows across the US and Europe. At 21.00 the stadium fell silent except for the sound of a solo Ukrainian trembita. The show then transitioned into *Vstavai*, a powerful song with social insight, and then a block of time-tested hits, *Mayzhe Vesna*, *Ty Sobi Sama*, and more.

Okean Elzy has their universal a set-list of chartbusters, however they also have a skill in their ability to perform an original

version of each song. Taking the performance past the core five musicians, a section of wind instruments and a mini-choir of backing vocalists featured also. In the middle of the performance there was an acoustic set, where the whole band gathered at the edge of the stage and played hits Nezalezhnist, Ne Pytai and the folk song, Oy, Chui Tam Kin Stoit.

Okean Elzy's concerts never fail when it comes to featuring a social context. Frontman Syvatoslav Vakarchuk called to free Oleg Sentsov and other political prisoners and even dedicated a song to them. There was also a patriotic flash mob where volunteers hoisted a massive national flag in the fan-zone. Whether they want it or not, Okean Elzy has become synonymous with patriotism and love for Ukraine. People flock to their concerts with flags and in national clothing, with even the national anthem ringing out on this evening.

It is perhaps with this in mind that talk of Vakarchuk possibly running for president is so common, with many anticipating he'll throw his hat in the ring. Yes, with his education in top US universities and previous experience of being a deputy in 2008, he has the chops to foot it in the political sphere. However, he isn't a politician, he's rock-star. A rock-star who wields his influence to effect change in his homeland without needing formal power. In 2017, Vakarchuk said he had

no political ambitions. Even the slogan of this concert was "Nothing but Music". And without a formal announcement from the man himself, his reentry into the political arena is nothing but speculation at this point.

Regardless, politics was far from the agenda on 24 August, where four hours of show, 37 songs and an impressive three encores kept the crowd of up to 100 000 people at Olympiyskiy in a shear frenzy. No one else in the country has that ability.







Taste of the Black Sea

AMIDST A VIBRANT, DIVERSE, AND RAPIDLY GROWING CULINARY SCENE IN KYIV, NEITHER ATLANTIC SEABASS NOR FRENCH OYSTERS HOLD THE CITY'S RESIDENTS OR TOURISTS IN AWE ANY LONGER. HOWEVER, A PLACE OFFERING LOCALLY CAUGHT FISH AND SEAFOOD WILL CERTAINLY CREATE A BUZZ



More than just a dining spot, this gastro fish restaurant opened its doors in July in an unostentatious district, between Lukianivska and Dorohozhychi metro stations. It is the sixth restaurant of the Chernomorka network with another five places operating in Kyiv and in Odesa.

COULEUR LOCALE

The restaurant's atmosphere sets the stage—its cosiness envelops as we enter and take our seats on the summer terrace. The nautical-themed interior immediately draws association with a port city on the Black Sea coast. All design accents—plain furniture, white washed brick walls adorned with flotation rings and oars, ceilings boasting boat shaped chandeliers, a tiled floor with a smartly distressed look (inside) and gravel (outside)—make us feel as if we are sitting in a small café on the sea coast listening to the relaxing sound of waves rolling in upon soft sands...

WHATEVER YOU WISH

No doubt, a huge ice showcase with fresh fish and seafood is the restaurant's pride and key attraction. The variety of delicacies is a visual treat. Apart from dorado, salmon, squid, baby octopus, scallops, tiger and royal shrimp tails, kin clip, and smelt supplied from all over the world, guests can get a full range of Ukrainian fish. Even their

names are mouth-watering – red and grey mullet, shark katran, sea fox, horse mackerel, knout goby, garfish, frog legs that are delivered from the Odesa and Kherson regions, and carp, crucian carp, catfish, pike perch from Dniester Estuary, sterlet, trout from the Zakarpattia oblast, and river eel from the Shatskiy lakes.

The venue has an open kitchen and special reservoir with live oysters supplied from France, Ireland, the Netherlands, and even Japan. Black Sea shellfish is also on the list. Clients can purchase fish and seafood at Chernomorka, get it scaled and cook it at home, or, stay here to appreciate the chef's talents. We choose the latter and decide to go local tonight.





WHETTING THE APPETITE

Following our server's advice, we take Forshmak to begin with. People flock to Chernomorka to try this specialty for good reason. One of the best forshmaks we have ever eaten, this cold starter is made out of delicious, juicy herring chopped and mixed with onions and apples that have a pleasant, slightly sour note. Bedded on an oyster shell, the spread comes with toast to set our tastebuds working.



has a texture similar to that of squid. Yet Chernomorka knows how to turn it to a delicate appetiser with a tender taste.

CATCH OF THE DAY

We go on indulging in Black Sea delectables. A signature dish, flatfish kalkan cooked on a charcoal brazier makes for the first part of our main course. We savour a thick chunk of a slightly fatty soft succulent white fish garnished with a wedge of lemon and sliced ginger. Piquantly enhanced with a charred flavour, it is has a rich taste sufficient in itself.

Afterwards, roasted stingray arrives at our table. Its tight and dense texture resembles beef. It is so nourishing we feel full after the first bite. Gourmet tips – take home whatever you can't finish at Chernomorka – quite often cold fish tastes even better.

SMALL EXCEPTION

The only exception we make to ordering local produce during our dinner is a choice of drinks. We go after light uncomplicated well-balanced Italian Pinot Grigio that is a good match for all of our dishes, and we forgo dessert to allow the Black Sea aftertaste to linger as long as possible.

Of course, all Chernomorka spots differ in their design and style. However, their quality and assortment remain in high demand as the network keeps expanding. The seventh restaurant is planned to open in early October on the Dnipro Embankment, Knyazhyi Zaton 16D.
